ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- A baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university
- Overall grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale. Applicants with less than a 3.0 who show extreme promise through other achievements may be granted admission.
- Proficiency in written and oral communication, college level math, and computer usage including word processing, spreadsheets, databases, and the Internet are required.
- Official undergraduate and graduate transcripts
- Two letters of recommendation
- Personal essay
- Completed application form

PROGRAM OF STUDY (30 CREDITS)

The MAcc requires students to take 30 credits. The courses taken will depend upon level of previous accounting and business education and career goals. A minimum of 18 credits are to be in the accounting area, the other 12 credits can be further accounting or MBA electives depending upon the student's educational needs and career interests.

This program is available to college graduates with all majors. Students will receive individual advisory assistance to develop a program of study that best suits their educational background and career interests.
