POST 9/11 AND YELLOW RIBBON

The Yellow Ribbon GI Education Enhancement Program (Yellow Ribbon Program) provides matching funds from the Department of Veterans Affairs as a supplement to the Post-9/11 GI Bill®. The Yellow Ribbon Program covers tuition and mandatory fees and does not include room and board or books and supplies which are provided for separately under the Post-9/11 GI Bill.

Tuition Assistance Program

The Tuition Assistance (TA) program provides financial assistance for voluntary off-duty education programs in support of a soldier’s professional and personal self-development goals. TA is available for courses that are offered in the classroom or by distance learning and is part of an approved academic degree or certificate program.

The **CHATHAM GRANT** is a need-based grant awarded to undergraduate students based on financial need and academic strength, and serves as a place holder in a student’s financial aid package. If your financial aid package includes a Chatham Grant and you are in the process of applying for additional merit scholarships through the University, your financial aid package will be recalculated once the additional merit scholarship has been awarded. As a result, the Chatham Grant will be replaced with the additional merit scholarship(s). If you do not apply for additional merit scholarships, or you are not awarded additional scholarships, and you received a Chatham Grant, your grant will not change, unless changes were made to your FAFSA, which affect your eligibility.

PRIOR LEARNING ASSESSMENT

Chatham’s Prior Learning Assessment program grants degree-seeking students the ability to be awarded academic credit for prior learning knowledge gained in advance of matriculating at Chatham. Knowledge gained from employment, job training, independent study, open courseware, volunteer and civic duties, military service and travel are just some examples that may prepare a student to earn credit through our Prior Learning Assessment program.
