IN 2021 AND 2020, THE SPENDABLE RETURN APPROXIMATED \$5,991,881 AND \$6,055,828, RESPECTIVELY, AND WAS TRANSFERRED TO BOARD-DESIGNATED ENDOWMENT. THE UNIVERSITY SATISFIED ITS SPENDING PROVISIONS OF INDIVIDUAL ENDOWMENT AGREEMENTS, INCLUDING "MUST" OR "SHALL" PROVISIONS, THROUGH THE USE OF OPERATING FUNDS WITHOUT DONOR RESTRICTIONS IN THE YEARS ASSETS APPROPRIATED WERE NOT DRAWN. THE UNIVERSITY BELIEVES THAT THIS SPENDING POLICY IS CONSISTENT WITH THE COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA'S GUIDELINES AND WITH THE UNIVERSITY'S OBJECTIVE TO MAINTAIN THE PURCHASING POWER OF THE ENDOWMENT ASSETS HELD IN PERPETUITY, AS WELL AS TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL REAL GROWTH THROUGH NEW GIFTS AND INVESTMENT RETURN.

THE UNIVERSITY CLASSIFIES AS NET ASSETS WITH DONOR RESTRICTIONS THE ORIGINAL VALUE OF GIFTS DONATED TO THE ENDOWMENT AND THE ORIGINAL VALUE OF SUBSEQUENT GIFTS TO THE ENDOWMENT. THE UNDISTRIBUTED AMOUNTS EARNED ARE INCLUDED IN NET ASSETS WITH DONOR RESTRICTIONS. IN ACCORDANCE WITH ACT 141, THE UNIVERSITY HAS ADOPTED A WRITTEN INVESTMENT POLICY, OF WHICH A SECTION SPECIFICALLY RELATES TO THE ENDOWMENT.

AT THE ONSET OF THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC, THE UNIVERSITY BEGAN FOCUSING INTENSELY ON MITIGATING THE ADVERSE IMPACTS OF THE OUTBREAK BY PROTECTING STUDENTS, FACULTY AND STAFF. CLASSROOM DELIVERY SHIFTED TO REMOTE LEARNING AND FACULTY AND STUDENTS QUICKLY ADAPTED TO A FULLY REMOTE ONLINE PLATFORM IN MID-MARCH 2020 AND THROUGH THE REMAINDER OF THE SPRING 2020 ACADEMIC TERM. RESIDENCE HALLS AND FOOD SERVICES WERE CLOSED AND ALL TRAVEL, SUMMER PROGRAMS AND CAMPS WERE CANCELLED.

SAFETY PROTOCOLS AND MONITORING PROCEDURES WERE ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY TO PREPARE FOR THE FALL 2020 ACADEMIC TERM TO ENSURE THE SAFETY OF THE STUDENTS, FACULTY AND STAFF. THESE PROCEDURES INCLUDED SAFE DISTANCING IN CLASSROOM AND RESIDENCE HALL SPACES, ONGOING CLEANING, AND INSTALLATION OF DEVICES TO ENSURE SAFE INTERFACE IN SHARED AND CUSTOMER-FACING SPACES. ENTRY TESTING OF STUDENTS WAS IMPLEMENTED FOR FALL 2020, SPRING 2021 AND FALL 2021 AND ONGOING TESTING WAS AVAILABLE FOR STUDENTS, FACULTY AND STAFF.

THESE MEASURES ENABLED THE UNIVERSITY TO COMPLETE A SUCCESSFUL 2020-2021 ACADEMIC YEAR. POSITIVE CASES WERE REPORTED TO THE CAMPUS COMMUNITY ON A WEEKLY BASIS; CASE COUNTS REMAINED LOW ALL YEAR DUE TO STRONG COMMUNITY COMPLIANCE. 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AND STAFF WAS COMMUNICATED PRIOR TO AND THROUGHOUT THE RETURN TO CAMPUS. VACCINATION WAS REQUIRED FOR ALL STUDENTS PARTICIPATING IN FACE-TO-FACE CLASSES OR CAMPUS ACTIVITIES AND FOR ALL FACULTY AND STAFF FOR THE 2021-2022 ACADEMIC TERM. THE UNIVERSITY ALLOWED STUDENTS AND EMPLOYEES WITH A VALID MEDICAL, RELIGIOUS, OR OTHER REASON CONSISTENT UNDER FEDERAL AND STATE LAW TO APPLY FOR AN EXEMPTION. ADDITIONALLY, STUDENT ATHLETES COMPLIED WITH TESTING PROTOCOL SET FORTH BY THE NCAA AND PRESIDENT'S ATHLETIC CONFERENCE (PAC).

THE UNIVERSITY RECEIVED GRANTS PURSUANT TO THE HIGHER EDUCATION EMERGENCY RELIEF FUND (HEERF) AS PART OF THE CORONAVIRUS AID, RELIEF, AND ECONOMIC SECURITY ACT (CARES ACT). IN JANUARY 2021 THE UNIVERSITY WAS AWARDED APPROXIMATELY \$1,840,000 AS PART OF THE CORONAVIRUS RESPONSE AND RELIEF SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS ACT (CRRSAA). IN MAY 2021, \$3,141,000 WAS AWARDED TO THE UNIVERSITY AS PART OF THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT (ARP).

BOTH AWARDS STIPULATED THAT THE UNIVERSITY DISTRIBUTE A PORTION OF THE TOTAL GRANTS RECEIVED TO ELIGIBLE STUDENTS, REFERRED TO AS PART A. THE REMAINING PORTION, REFERRED TO AS PART B, IS AVAILABLE TO COVER EXPENSES ASSOCIATED WITH SIGNIFICANT CHANGES TO THE DELIVERY OF INSTRUCTION DUE TO THE DISRUPTIONS CAUSED BY THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC INCURRED ON OR AFTER MARCH 13, 2020, INCLUDING REFUNDS PROCESSED TO STUDENTS, ENHANCEMENTS TO ONLINE LEARNING PLATFORMS AND OTHER TECHNOLOGY RELATED EXPENSES, AND CERTAIN OTHER QUALIFYING EXPENSES THAT
